

HISTORIA

DIABLICOS SUCIOS

El baile que realizan los llamados “Diablicos Sucios”, representa solamente una de las nueve danzas del Corpus Christi. El nombre proviene del hecho que antiguamente su indumentaria era confeccionada con tela manta sucia, que luego era pintada con rayas negras y rojas, calcadas con achiote y carbón, pero que después de un tiempo los colores se corrían al mezclarse con el sudor dando el aspecto de estar sucios. Si tratamos de esclarecer los orígenes de ésta manifestación, los diablicos sucios carecen de lenguaje por lo que podemos asegurar de que ésta pantomima sirvió de acecho a los nuevos devotos de la fe cristiana como reemplazo de una regla que sirviera para comunicarse, determinando así un personaje “sucio”, amedrentador, al cual debían de temer puesto que representaba al Rey de las Tinieblas, Satanás, el mismo Diablo, elemento que era totalmente opuesto a las enseñanzas de Dios, que la Iglesia Católica representaba y que abrazaba a los nuevos creyentes de esta religión.

La Danza de Diablico Sucio puede considerarse entonces como la más antigua tradición o representación en las celebraciones de Corpus Christi en La Villa de Los Santos y con el tiempo se le incorporaron elementos claramente hispánicos como el castañuelo, el repique de pie o zapateo el acompañamiento musical con la mejoranera, además de una coreografía que se constituyó como elemento esencial en las otras danzas que fueron surgiendo con el correr del tiempo.

History

DIRTY DIABLICOS DANCE

The dance that the so called “Dirty Diablicos” perform, represents only one of the nine dances of the Corpus Christi. The name came from the fact that in the ancient time its attire was confectionated with dirty tissue, which was painted thereafter with black and red stripes, made with achiote and coal, but after some times the colors would run out as they mix with sweats giving the aspect of being dirty.

If we try to clarify the origin of this manifestation, the dirty Diablicos lack of language, therefore we assure that this mimic served as a guardian of the Christian faith new devoted like a replacement of a rule that was used to communicate, determining this way a dirty person, annoying, which had to be feared, since it represented the King of the darkness, Satan, the Devil himself, an element that is completely opposed to God's lectures, that the Catholic Church represented and the new believers of this religion embraced. The Diablico Dance then can be considered as the oldest tradition or a representation of the Corpus Christi celebration in Los Santos Villa, and with time some hispanic elements were clearly added such as the castañuelos, the “repique de pie” or shoe stepping and the musical acompañgment like the mejoranera, besides the choreography that was constituted as an essential element in the other dances that emerged with time.
